GOALS OF LEADERSHIP MISSOULA

- To cultivate and motivate community leaders
- To acquaint participants with community needs and problems, while offering alternatives for solutions
- To give participants an opportunity to meet community leaders, to associate in a meaningful way with their peers and to be motivated toward greater community involvement
- Introduce participants to leadership skills in the second year of involvement planning sessions
- Building connections with fellow business men and women, networking, referring professionally, mentorship, personal and professional growth

SELECTION, TUITION & SCHOLARSHIPS

 Candidates will be selected with a goal of establishing a diverse mix of professions, activities, backgrounds and perspectives.

Class size is limited!

- o Tuition:
 - o \$1.500 for Chamber Members
 - \$1,950 for Non-Chamber Members
 Tuition fee is payable upon acceptance in the program. This fee covers the costs of the beginning and ending retreats, individual session meals, materials and group transportation. Tuition is non-refundable and must be paid in full by September 1, 2019.
 - Scholarships may be available in a limited number and cover partial tuition fees. Typically these are awarded to nonprofit organizations or individuals not affiliated with a business. Small businesses and entrepreneurs are encouraged to apply.

APPLICATIONS DUE:

- Early deadline: prior to Friday, May 17, 2019 \$50 non-refundable application fee
- Late deadline: May 18 June 3, 2019: \$60 non-refundable application fee

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Leadership Missoula participants will initiate their experience with a two-day, mandatory beginning retreat in October. This is followed by eight all-day sessions held over the next several months and concludes with a two-day mandatory retreat in May.
- Two-year commitment: Graduates of the class will work together the following year to organize two session days each for the next Leadership Missoula class. Second year will include fundraising and professional speaking as well as organization of session days for the LM 38 class.
- Participants may not be absent for more than 2.5 days total. Both the beginning and ending retreats are mandatory. Failure to meet mandatory retreat attendance and/or exceeding the 2.5 missed days will result in a failure to graduate. Class members who fail to meet the attendance requirements will not be invited to attend graduation, receive their plaque or LM pin and will not be allowed to participate in the planning of the session days with their fellow class members in year two.
